Presentation Day 7 December

Our annual presentation day assemblies will be held next Wednesday morning in the school hall. The K-2 assembly will commence at 9:00am followed by the Years 3-6 assembly at 10:00am. These assemblies are the culmination of all of our student's hard work and while a select few will be acknowledge for their successes throughout the year, it is also a celebration of the critical and important work undertaken by everyone involved in the education of our students here at Lake Munmorah. We would very much like everyone to come along and I look forward to seeing many of you there.

Rotary Citizenship Awards 2016

Last night I had the great pleasure of attending the 2016 Rotary Primary Citizenship Awards evening at Hallekulani Bowling Club. Two of our outstanding Year 6 students – Toby D and Sally W were acknowledged for their citizenship qualities and for the contributions they make to their families, school and community. They were awarded medallions and a certificate and will be placed on the Rotary Club's Honour Roll. Well done and congratulations to you both, the school is proud of you.

<u>Classes 2017</u>

We have finalised our classes for next year and all students have been allocated to their respective classes and teachers. A great deal of time is taken by staff in composing classes and a range of considerations such as academic levels, social and emotional factors, and the best interests of the student are factored into placements. Similar to last year, all students will spend time with their new teacher in the last week of term to allow them to become familiar with the teacher's expectations and the requirements for next year. This year they will be together for three days, being the period 13-15 December. We find that by spending time in their new classes the students are well prepared when they return to us in the new year and any important transitional information about students is well communicated between staff members.

Industrial Action – Thursday 8 December

The NSW Teachers Federation has announced it will hold a stop work meeting of school teachers and non-school based Teaching Service (OCAA) members on Thursday 8 December 2016. Federation members will be attending a stop work meeting at a local venue from 8:30am but will resume duties as soon as possible after the one-hour meeting. It is important to note that the school will remain open and supervision will be provided during the period of the action. All students are expected to attend school, however, you may choose to delay your child's arrival at school by one hour if this is convenient to you. The Year 6 transition high school program that commences on that day will go ahead as planned, without disruption. The Lake Munmorah High School website has details regarding this.

Health Care Support of Students – Another Important Reminder

The school is happy to support families of those students who may have health care needs that need to be attended to while at school. Quite a number of students have care needs that either require the regular administration of medication at school or the careful management of conditions such as asthma or anaphylaxis. To ensure that we discharge our responsibilities effectively we need families to provide us with detailed information from a health care professional, usually a doctor, as to how the school can best support the child at school. We use this information to develop health care plans which describe exactly what care is required

at school. It is an imperative that we receive advice from a health professional at time of enrolment or if there is a change to the health care arrangements for a child and this includes any changes to medication. Your assistance in providing current and up to date information from your Doctor is appreciated.

Last week Mikaelah very bravely lost her long locks of hair with her mother cutting her hair in front of the school. I must say she looks terrific with shorter hair and it really suits her. By doing this she successfully raised \$6,000.00 which will go to the Cancer Council. Well done Mikaelah.

It is always wonderful to see our families enjoying time with each other and sharing these special moments with their children.










Mikaelahs Recount

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
