

PBL News

This week our focus in PBL is "Empathy". This goes hand-in-hand with last week's topic, "Feelings". Empathy is the ability to understand how another person is feeling – to 'walk in someone else's shoes' and it is an important attribute to develop in children. Children who are able to recognise their own feelings and demonstrate self-regulation are far more able to show empathy for others which is why we need to focus on both of these topics.

At school each class will be looking at a range of hypothetical situations that are common at school and discussing how we can show empathy and kindness to others. We will be reading Stand in My Shoes by Bob Samson to introduce this topic.



Developing empathy takes time and comes more naturally to some children. You can help your child by empathising with them when they are feeling sad or angry, for example, and by modeling empathy for others. This can be achieved when watching television together by simply discussing how characters are feeling and showing empathy for them.

PBL Team

This week our PBL team met to discuss all things PBL. Our meeting involved analysis of behaviour data which allows us to plan our lessons and interventions based on student need. This term we are noticing a slight increase in the number of students not following instructions in the classroom and therefore this will be a focus in the coming weeks in our lessons.

From time to time, you may hear from your child's teacher regarding your child's behaviour in class. While this can be upsetting, working collaboratively with your child's teacher to solve behaviours issues can have a powerful affect.
