Crossing the Bridge

Each day we have a staff member accompany students across the bridge for afternoon pick-up. Please make it very clear to your child where to meet you. If a child is unable to find a parent or carer, they must stay with the teacher. On occasion, parents or carers are held up or children are confused about the arrangements with family. Students are to remain with the teacher, until the parent/carer arrives, or walked to the office by the duty teacher and calls made to confirm pick-up.

High School students

If you have arranged for a sibling to collect a primary aged student from our school, please discuss the expectations we have of them while they are waiting. We expect them to sit quietly, stay seated in the area just inside the school grounds outside the office and be respectful towards teachers, primary school children, parents, community members and peers. If they are unable to comply with these expectations, they will be asked to leave.

Drop off in the mornings

There are a number of families dropping students off in the bus bay each morning in times designated for buses only. Police randomly patrol the area and fine drivers who use the bus bay at these times. Please use the parking across the street and walk children across the manned crossing. Dianne, our Crossing Supervisor is friendly and professional, and is always happy to say hello to all

families using the crossing each day. Alternatively, use the Kiss and Drop area located before the pedestrian crossing. A teacher is on duty there every morning from 8.45 to 9.00 to welcome students into the school each day. I encourage everyone to use the safest option for dropping off and picking up each day.

Every week, classes visit the library for one hour. During this time, we explore the wonder of books and talk about the benefits of being a regular reader. We examine a wide range of topics through a variety of book genres, text types, authors, formats and multi-modal texts. We also engage in interesting discussions on local, National and International issues.

This year the library will run 8 Book Clubs (2 per term), 2 Book Fairs – one later this term (more info to come), celebrate Book Week and host the Book Parade (Term 3), and at the end of the

year have the Giving Tree, and maybe some other treats along the way.

All students are encouraged to be regular borrowers. Equally important is that they be regular returners too! Kindergarten – Year 4 loans are for 2 weeks, Year 5 & 6 for 3. Books can be returned anytime during this time or renewed just by asking!

It is preferable that ALL students have a library bag to borrow books. NO BAG - NO BORROWING.

Unfortunately, too many books are ruined by leaking drink bottles, squashed bananas and wayward Vegemite sandwiches when they are in school bags unprotected. It would be greatly
