Welcome back for 2021

Every week, classes visit the library for one hour. During this time, we explore the wonder of books and talk about the benefits of being a regular reader. We examine a wide range of topics through a variety of book genres, text types, authors, formats and multi-modal texts. We also engage in interesting discussions on local, National and International issues.

This year the library will run 8 Book Clubs (2 per term), 2 Book Fairs – one later this term (more info to come), celebrate Book Week and host the Book Parade (Term 3), and at the end of the year have the Giving Tree, and maybe some other treats along the way.

All students are encouraged to be regular borrowers. Equally important is that they be regular returners too! Kindergarten – Year 4 loans are for 2 weeks, Year 5 & 6 for 3. Books can be returned anytime during this time or renewed just by asking!

It is preferable that ALL students have a library bag to borrow books. NO BAG - NO BORROWING.

Unfortunately, too many books are ruined by leaking drink bottles, squashed bananas and wayward Vegemite sandwiches when they are in school bags unprotected. It would be greatly appreciated if you could provide a library bag for your child. A 15c bag from Coles, Aldi or Woolies is a great option (and it's waterproof!) But, FYI, our School Locker has an awesome library bag for \$13.00 which is strong and stylish and will last forever!

Attendance Recognition at LMPS

Regular attendance at school is essential to assist students to:

- provide access to the best possible education
- maximise their potential
- develop important skills and knowledge to help them learn
- · maintain positive peer relationships
- · develop social and emotional skills such as good communication, resilience and team work

Students are required to attend school every day possible. It is acceptable for children to stay at home for various reasons, however, reasons other than illness, appointment, family emergencies or cultural reasons are deemed unjustified. Even if it the cat's birthday, students need to be attending school to ensure they are allowing themselves the best possible access to their education. Holidays during the school term are deemed 'unjustified' absences.


This year, at LMPS we will be recognising students who are attending 95% or above each term. This recognition will come in many different forms and alter from term to term. If your child is unwell, please justify their absence by notifying the school via the Sentral Parent Portal or written note within 7 down of the

note within 7 days of the absence. If your child is away for 3 or more consecutive days. 
